2021 Sundance a significant event after a challenging year.

A year ago, out of concern for the health and safety of dancers and their home communities, BHF's Director of Indigenous Services, Elder and Sundance Chief Mike Calder made the decision to cancel the annual Northwind Lodge Sundance. As the 2021 Sundance approached, the decision was made to go ahead with this year's ceremony, with fewer dancers, physical distancing, and everyone asked to be fully vaccinated. July 14 was Tree Day, then 47 men and women entered the Sundance arbour. Despite the extreme heat, 27 dancers completed the ceremony, dancing and fasting until July 18. Five dancers were recognized for completing their four year commitment to Sundance.

At a time when Indigenous communities have been confronted with so many challenges – disproportionate impacts of covid-19, resistance to the truth of the historic assault on Indigenous culture and identity, the trauma of the deaths of children in residential schools – we are grateful to have access to teachings and ceremony as part of healing from addiction and co-occurring mental health issues.
